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THE NEED AND RELEVANCE

•The future of Jesuit education relies on the availability of people, Jesuits and colleagues in mission alike, who are fully capable of leading universities and colleges in a manner consistent with and devoted to the mission of the Society of Jesus.

TO BE IGNATIAN

 This availability depends on the ongoing intention to cultivate such mission inspired leaders and to invest in formational opportunities

characterized by an Ignatian way of proceeding, a manner that is both faithful to our nearly 500-year-old tradition

while at the same time constantly discerning, creative, and evolutionary.



THE TASK FORCE - BILBAO

 While such intentions and opportunities exist currently at the local, regional, national, and international levels, the Task Force on Ignatian Leadership proposed that the emerging global network of Jesuit institutions of higher education presented an opportunity to leverage essential resources even more effectively and sustainably for the long-term service of the mission priorities of the apostolate of Jesuit higher education.



IGNATIAN LEADER?

- •What distinguishes an *Ignatian* leader, then? Simple formulations will fall badly short, because 'Ignatian Leadership' is not a coherent theory, or a body of scholarship.

- **DOING:** Skills / Competencies / Techniques. Focusing on necessary practical elements we need to fulfil the mission
- •BEING: Transformation / Values / Beliefs. Developing integrity, values, character, and authenticity




KEY

MODULES

- 1. Called to leadership: dealing with individual
- 2. Leadership for and with others: dealing with others
- 3. Called to live in organisations: organisational culture
- 4. Leadership at the peripheries: commitment to the Marginalised





POSSIBLE PROGRAMMES

- 1. Three day programme: Orientation
- 2. One month: After the recruitment of faculty, before placing them in departments
- 3. One year programme, spread out through the academic year, Sat/Sun: for all the faculty, non-teaching staff
- 4. Week long programme: young Jesuits
- 5. Boot camp/retreat/workshop...



HOW WE CAN

- •Form a team that consists of Jesuits and lay in each Zone, make it a zonal programme (being faithful to networking-collaboration)
- Adapt the modules given by Office of Discernment and Apostolic Planning to suit to our context
- where ever possible arrange to give a certificate or diploma
- Make it mandatory for academic leadership such Deans, Vice-Principals...



In April 1-4, 2019, there is a training programme organised by the Office of Discernment and Apostolic Planning in Rome on Ignatian Leadership that would probably give sufficient resources and modules
